Approval of Minutes

Legislative Update

One of the important tasks of the Board of Education is to send a board member to the IASB Delegate Assembly at the Triple I conference in Chicago in November. The legislative committee gives counsel to board members, to agree or disagree with IASB recommendations. We may need a special meeting after we receive IASB recommendations.

The board members and Dr. Russell stay in touch with legislators, especially with local legislators, county board members and village officials.

Dr. Russell has been working with local health department to lobby legislators. Some topics of focus have been:

- o Changing definition of close contact on a bus.
- o Test to stay, not supported by local health department even though IDPH supported it.

The District held a vaccination clinic for teachers and municipal workers along with seniors.

DuPage PADS is housing the growing homeless population in underutilized hotels such as Red Roof Inn. PADS is planning to buy Red Roof Inn with federal money and county board help. They plan on presenting to the county board in November for approval.

The committee would like to know how the District could be supported financially, for wrap-around services, social assistance, transportation with increase in population. Some possibilities include:

- Navigator stipend-county social work program to provide someone who will work with the kids.
- Student distribution to other schools as numbers increase at a particular location.
- Other services in the community that can benefit the parents/adults.

Legislative Breakfast

Legislators, community members and administrators will be invited. Question and answer with legislators with focus on education legislation. Last year the breakfast was done virtually with breakout rooms. It was well received. Maybe plan on doing part virtually and part breakout rooms. Aramark is a potential site.

IEA/NEA Update

IEA interviews candidates who indicate inclination to run for office. They support the candidates based on their views on education topics. Their recommendations go to IPACE committee at state. Encourage student teaching at higher education institutions.
